Visitors can wander and meet and talk with locals from the past: fisher folk telling how the smokie was made; how the women carried the men on their backs out to the boats to keep the (male) feet dry before they set out to fish in the cold unforgiving North Sea; how the children worked baitin' the lines and also helped farmers harvest the fields.

Since the closure of the Diocesan Centre for re-use by the Dundee and Angus Foodbank, the diocese has changed ways of working: and has also been working on finding new homes for the items previously located in St. John's for its many years as a Scottish Episcopal Church.

While the larger items have been successfully distributed some of the smaller items still remain. An open day has been planned for 4th September at St Ninian's for everyone to see what is still available.



There are limited items remaining as we have successfully re-homed many items from St John's. The few items remaining include some choir robes, collection plates, some candlesticks and brassware, some communion plate. The items were all used for the life of the community of St John's and will be of use for years to come.
