### Change to COVID guidelines for Places of Worship



## Updated guidance on coronavirus

Relaxation of certain restrictions relevant to places of worship took effect on 26 April, notably in relation to the cap on numbers permitted to attend communal worship services. Details and links:

### Church capacity

The previously cap of 50 people was removed when all of Scotland enters Level 3 of the Covid-19 restrictions system, and that places of worship with adequate capacity will be able to accommodate an attendance higher than 50 people provided social distancing guidelines can be adhered to. For many churches this makes no difference as their physical capacity would not allow a number as high as 50. For larger buildings where the capacity, especially given households attending, this may be an advantage.

Advice on how to calculate the maximum capacity for the building is also be developed and further advice will follow on this.

Occasional offices—weddings and funerals—can now also have 50 attending in the congregation, an increase from the previous 20.

On 17th May other guidance and requirements on e.g. signage related to capacity in church buildings will come into effect. The Advisory Group intends to issue further guidance to support these changes. Discussions are ongoing between churches and the Scottish Government on these and other issues of relaxation of restrictions.

### Hospital visiting

The Scottish Government has also published updated guidance on hospital visits, including a section on Spiritual Care.
