More events are planned in the cathedral through October in the run up to the COP26 climate change conference in Glasgow. The Cathedral Eco Group is launching a climate challenge on Sunday October 3rd, Harvest Festival. As these are the weeks leading up to COP26 they would like to encourage people to commit to taking part during October. Each week the challenge will be on a different topic. The five topics are: food, tread lightly (travel), live simply (rethink, re-use, recycle etc.), gardening/ biodiversity, domestic energy reduction.

RIP Peter Sanderson, former Provost

Peter Sanderson, who was Provost of St Paul's Cathedral Dundee from May 1984 to October 1991, has died aged 92. Peter, who had studied and ministered in the Church of England, continued work on restoration and development of the cathedral. The Companionship relationship with the Diocese of Iowa had started in 1977, and after his time as Provost, Peter ministered for some years in the Diocese of Iowa as the Vicar of All Saints', Storm Lake. He retired to New Mexico in 2006. Please remember him and his family in your prayers.

Still very relevant: A good network has already been established in Dundee to support the previously resettled Syrian refugee families, supported by a Scottish Refugee Council staff member. They are now looking to gather support for Afghan refugees arriving in the area. The Support Network for Afghans arriving in Scotland has a Google form (link below) to capture offers of help and generates a standard response from the generic mailbox, to put it into a 'holding' position until the Scottish Refugee Council knows more about where people will be resettled and their needs.
