General Synod of the Scottish Episcopal Church 2022: Report

The annual General Synod of the SEC met in Edinburgh last week in a 'hybrid' format with both in-person and online 'Zoom' participation. The first reading (of two readings) of a new Canon for the election of bishops, Canon 4, was passed following much debate and will come to Diocesan Synods for review in 2023 and to General Synod for a second and final reading, also in 2023. The proposed canon has more flexibility on timescales and shortlists and also works for a greater degree of confidentiality. The Synod also approved 'gender inclusive' changes to the 1982 liturgy so these are now part of the official liturgies of the church.

Many reports on areas of the life of the church and the church's boards and committees were received. The business of setting quota and budgets for the Province assuming deficit budgets for the next few years. These deficits are in part to minimise the financial burdens on, and to support Diocese and Charges as they recover from the pandemic and face the current financial crises.

Special attention was paid to the refugee crisis in Ukraine and to the ongoing work to try and achieve carbon-zero in the SEC by 2030. And socialising between the representatives of different Dioceses was at last possible for the first time since 2019!
