Covid-19: No Change this Weekend



The First Minister announced this week that many of the enhanced Covid regulations are going to be relaxed from Monday, the 24th of January. The Advisory Group of the Scottish Episcopal Church will be meeting this week, and revised guidance/FAQs etc. will be then issued. For this coming weekend (22nd & 23rd Jan) the current guidance on physical distancing, the suspension of normal self-service refreshments and the other 'Omicron' constraints still apply.

The relaxed constraints will take us back to where we were before Christmas 2021. For future planning for e.g. choir spacing, household distancing, more relaxed serving of refreshments at services and other outreach events, it is reasonable to assume we will be as we were in November and December last year. Face coverings remain mandatory, the use of LFD testing should still be done, ventilation where practical and above all, all are encouraged to get boosters whenever possible.
