Aberlour Christingle appeal 2022

Please find below a message that Bishop Andrew wishes to share with you, from Aberlour, the SEC-supported children's charity:



By holding a Christingle service in aid of Aberlour this Advent or Christmas, you can show children across Scotland that there is hope. Any money raised will directly help children and families living in poverty. 2022 hasn't quite been the return to normality we hoped for, with many families across Scotland continuing to struggle due to the cost-of-living crisis. Since April 2020, Aberlour has awarded over £2.3 million in small cash grants to over 6,500 families, to buy basic necessities for their children, such as food, clothing, bedding and utilities.

Aberlour are only in the position to help children thanks to the incredibly generous donations from our wonderful supporters, but demand for our Urgent Assistance Fund continues to rise. Due to lack of funds, we are currently only able to help 1 in 4 of the families who apply for an emergency cash grant. It is heart-breaking to turn down desperate families who have nowhere else to turn to. By holding a Christingle service in aid of Aberlour, your congregation can help us make sure that we never have to do that again.
