Message from Fr Andrew Murphy

The food-bag queues after Sunday Mass are steadily increasing each week. If you have been following the Gospel readings for this year, mainly from Matthew, you will have 'clocked' that it is all about changing ourselves to come closer to God.

Perhaps here we could reflect on the words of St John Henry Newman whose feast day was a fortnight ago: "To live is to change, and to be perfect is to have changed often." So let us continue on our journey throughout all the changes outside and within, to perfection and holiness.

With changes so frequent and dramatic as they are at the moment, and even as I write Dundee has been upped to level 3



restrictions, things can be very uncertain, and so easy it is to lose confidence in our mission, however the Psalmist reminds us that amongst those of us with faith, no matter what changes occur, one thing remains a constant - God's love for us in Jesus Christ. Christ is present always amongst us in the blessed Sacrament we reserve in the tabernacle in the church sanctuary. "I love you Lord, my strength, my rock, my fortress, my Saviour. My God is my rock where I take my refuge, my shield, my stronghold." Let us remember always to seek refuge and strength in the Lord so we can move forward with confidence and hope in the mighty victory that lies ahead.

May God bless us, keep you safe, until the times we can all worship Him together.
