John Wyllie has been announced as the new Head of Safeguarding. Full news of the appointment will appear in 'Inspires Online' later this month. A brief except from the magazine states:

"John has spent the last 35 years in public service firstly for 5 years in the British Army and then in policing, from where he retired as a Detective Superintendent - his most recent role saw him leading on work to protect Ukrainian displaced people, leading the airport security operation at COP26 and also providing oversight of serious crime investigations across Scotland. He has worked across the world assisting countries to develop their training and capabilities to protect vulnerable groups, leading programmes from Bhutan to Malawi, with a range of partners including UNICEF, The Asia Foundation and the European Union. John has also worked with the 5Rights Foundation developing international efforts to protect children and young people from on-line harm. John is married to Nicola, a Primary School teacher and they have three adult children, Katie, Scott and Ross."

John will start in post on 17 April.

SEI Lent Series "Teach Us to Pray: A Close Reading of the Lord's Prayer"

This series, presented by the Revd Dr Michael Hull, reads the Lord's Prayer closely and deliberately to unpack the ways in which it glorifies God and petitions for humanity's spiritual and physical needs. The Series will be offered on the Mondays of Lent 2023 at 7pm in six 30-minute webinars, each of which will be posted on YouTube. The Series is meant to be a resource for Christians to use creatively during the Season of Lent, for example as a refresher course for individuals or a conversation starter for church groups, with discussion questions at the end of each webinar. The presenter, Revd Dr Michael Hull, is the Director of Studies at the Scottish Episcopal Institute in Edinburgh, whose previous Advent and Lent Series have been greatly valued across the Province and beyond. <u>Creating Hope Together: ScotGov sui-</u> cide prevention strategy 2022-2032

From Rev Denise Herbert, Diocesan Safeguarding Officer: Suicide in Scotland is a significant public health issue which affects all age groups and communities. Although no-one is immune from suicide, some individuals are at greater risk. Data from the Scottish Suicide Information Database (ScotSID) report, profiling suicide deaths between 2011 and 2019 shows: Just under three quarters of all suicides in Scotland are male. Almost half (46%) were aged 35-54. Death by suicide is approximately three times more likely among those living in the most socioeconomically deprived areas than among those living in the least deprived area. 88% of people that die by suicide are of working age with two-thirds of these in employment at the time of their death.

We often hear about mental health issues, especially amongst young people, but any one of us could be at risk at any time, of feeling despair and hopelessness and whilst we hope our faith will support us it is one safeguarding issue that maybe we don't think about but if we come across someone who seems to be despairing or withdrawn perhaps we need to stop and wonder if help is needed. Just passing on the thought to someone who might have more knowledge is a lot better than not saying anything though sadly, quite often, the person who is thinking of taking their own life does not say so and the family have no idea that the person has it in mind.
