### Celebration and Licensing of Lay Ministries at St Mary's Broughty Ferry

Bishop Andrew joined Rector Mark-Aaron Tisdale and the congregation of St Mary's Broughty Ferry for their 11am Eucharist last Sunday (23rd April) and was delighted to give licences to authorise and affirm lay ministries in the life of the church.

Elaine Hammersley, was re-affirmed as a Lay Reader in the Diocese of Brechin after a break from this ministry. She joins Sue Rowe as a Lay Reader based in Broughty Ferry. Graeme Stirling and Ruth Toy were licensed as Lay Worship Leaders, a role they have exercised for some time in the charge. Lis Thoms joined the worship team as she was licensed as a Lay Worship Leader after a time of training and development under the guidance of Mark-Aaron.

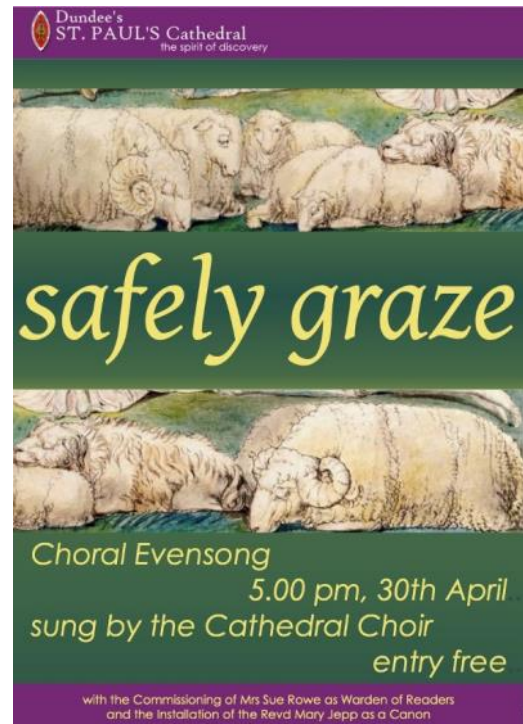
This team assists the charge in the leading of worship: and the many other ministries in the church were also affirmed in prayer and appreciation as part of this celebration.

### 5pm on 30th April at the Cathedral Installation of a Canon and Commissioning of Warden of Lay Readers

There will be another celebration of ministry this coming Sunday at St Paul's Cathedral, Dundee. At the 5pm evensong, entitled 'Safely Graze', the Rev Mary Jepp, priest for Muchalls and Stonehaven, will be installed as a 'Chapter Canon', one of the senior clergy in the Diocese who support and guide the Bishop in matters of Mission and Ministry. At the same service, Sue Rowe will be formally commissioned as the Diocesan Warden of Lay Readers, the co-ordinator of support and ministry for all of the Lay Readers who serve in the Diocese of Brechin.



Please do attend if you are able: all are very welcome indeed! Clergy and Lay Readers are welcome to robe and process into the cathedral.

## **Lambeth Conference Phase 3**

The Lambeth Conference met in Canterbury in 2022. The Bishops met beforehand (Phase 1) and met in person in England (Phase 2). The theme was to explore what it means to be 'God's Church for God's World'. This was done by the bishops considering 'Calls' on key aspects of Anglican church life.

The organisers have now announced that the conference journey now continues as we take forward these "Lambeth Calls" and outcomes of the conference into the life of the Anglican Communion. The Bishops will encourage engagement with the 'Calls' in the life of our churches. Bishop Andrew will share his experiences and perspectives and the wider SEC will also share the impact that the Calls can have on our Ministry, Mission, Witness and so many other aspects of our shared discipleship.
