The End of One Story and the Beginning of Another: Dean Fay Lamont Retires

A mixture of emotions was on display at St. Ninian's this past Sunday (2nd July) as Dean Fay Lamont celebrated her last service before a very well earned retirement.

As a testament of her 20 years of ministry at St. Ninians, Mid Craigie, over 100 people attended as the congregation was joined by those in the community whose lives she has touched. The service was full of a wonderful mixture of laughter and tears as the church community celebrated this bittersweet moment. The youth of the church, all of whom Fay had known from their very earliest days, came forward during this service to present Fay with her retirement gifts.

After the service, a special reception was held with a buffet and speeches from members of the congregation. A special cake in the shape of the 'Wee White Church' was shared at the celebration. A PowerPoint slideshow was presented showing some of the many and varied activities that have been part of Fay's long and happy time at St Ninian's

During her ministry St. Ninian's, Fay cared for the congregation and led them in their worshipping life. She was a leading member of the Girls' Brigade unit that was based at St Ninian's until recently and she was very involved in the running of the 'Stay and Play' group at the church. She also had chaplaincy responsibilities to Rowantree Primary and Craigie High as well as involvement in the running of many local charities and initiatives.

The members of the church wished her all the best in retirement and told her to take some much needed rest

as she prepared to move onto new projects, activities and use of her time.

Fay (short for Euphemia) came from the west coast of Scotland and originally trained in youth work. She then trained in the Church of Scotland at St Colm's College and became a C of S deaconess in 1977. She came to Dundee and worked in the community in many roles from 1977 to 2000. In 2000 she was ordained into the Scottish Episcopal Church and served a curacy at Holy Trinity

Monifieth. She became a team priest at St Ninian's in 2003, then Priest in Charge in 2007. In her time in the Diocese of Brechin she was a Chapter Canon, Diocesan Mission and Ministry Officer, Diocesan Director of Ordinands and served on all of the committees and groups that support the life of the Diocese. In 2019 Bishop Andrew asked Fay if she would be willing to take on the role of the Dean of the Diocese. Much to the Bishop's delight, she accepted and has been a greatly valued and highly effective Dean for the past four years.

Fay will retire nearby in Dundee so we will continue to see her in the life of the churches and wider community of Dundee.

With Fay's retirement, Rev Canon Kenneth Gibson has accepted Bishop Andrew's offer to take over the role of Dean. Kenneth, as Rector of Carnoustie, was Fay's training incumbent while she was at Holy Trinity Monifieth from 2000 to 2003, so that partnership continues, in a sense! Kenneth will be installed as Dean at a special Evensong at the Cathedral on Sunday 27th August. During this service, the Bishop is pleased to state that Fay will be installed as 'Dean Emeritus' and she will continue with this status as effectively a very well deserved honorary canon of St Paul's Cathedral, Dundee.
