All are very welcome indeed!



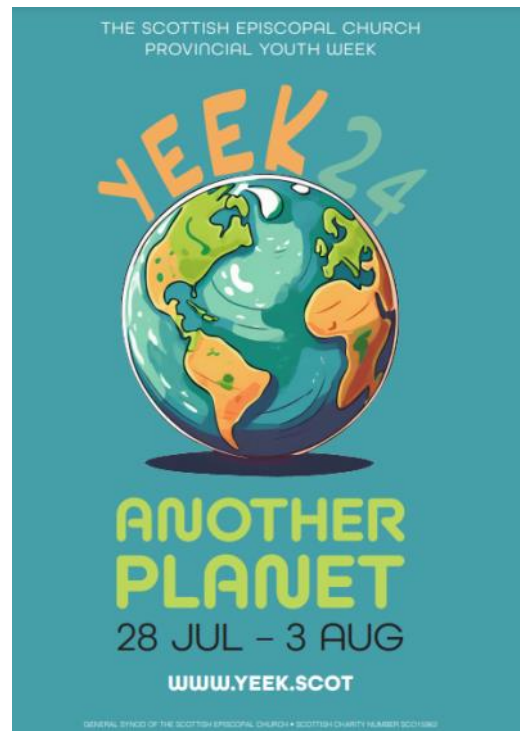
### One Space Left: Pilgrimage to Iona

### Bishop's Lent Appeal 2024: “Save the Children: Gaza Crisis” Appeal
