
Call for Prayer for the Middle East

I urge all of our churches to pray for an end to the suffering of so many innocent people in these conflicts with their extremes of power imbalances. Please continue to pray for wisdom and action from those in political office, for cease fires in these places and, above all, for peace in the Holy Land.


Prof Waller's title is: 'Wholeness and Holiness!' She will



Energy Footprint Tool Request

A request from Prof Peter Sharp, Diocesan Net Zero Representative: Recently vestry treasurers will have received an email from the Net Zero Team asking them to input data into the Energy Footprint Tool. Possibly because no deadline for responses was given, relatively few charges in Brechin have responded so far. It is very simple to complete; at the least you simply have to give details from your charge's annual energy bill(s) for 2023. Its importance is that it provides you with your carbon footprint for that year and so you will be able to see how, in future years, measures that you have put in place have reduced your carbon emissions.
