

Service Celebrating Dundee-Nablus Links—26 January at 5pm

There will be a special service at the Cathedral, on Sunday, 26th January 2025, at 5:00 pm to celebrate the links between Dundee and Nablus, Palestine with which Dundee is twinned. The service will also celebrate the link between St. Luke's Church in Dundee, and St. Philip's Church in Nablus. This service will honour the twinning of our two cities, with prayers for peace in the Holy Land and a spirit of unity. We are delighted to welcome a delegation from Nablus, including Fr. Jamil, priest of St. Philip's Church.

Following the service, there will be a reception in the Cathedral to meet our guests and strengthen the ties of friendship between our communities. We hope to see you there for this evening of prayer, connection, and shared commitment to peace.

Denis Duncan Lecture—Restorative Presence: Presence, Belonging, and the Journey of Healing

On 30th January from 7-9pm GoHealth in partnership with The Church of Scotland present this year's Denis Duncan Lecture. Join Prof John Swinton on this online lecture, filmed in Aberdeen, as he explores how to create healing communities of presence and belonging founded on the ministry of Jesus. With stories, practical suggestions and profound theology, John invites each of

us into a vision of Christian community that does not seek to 'fix' brokenness but rather honour each person's unique journey. He explores in depth the lived experience of those with mental health problems and makes practical suggestions for churches in extending and deepening their ministry for those who suffer.




The Welcome Audit: Trailblazers in Brechin Diocese wanted to try new Children's Engagement resource!

Solar Panels and Other Energy Retrofit Considerations for Listed Church Buildings 27 February (Thursday) from 1:00 to 2:00pm

This webinar, administered by the technology and policy teams from Historic Environment Scotland, will focus on the suitability of solar panels and other

energy retrofit solutions in terms of achieving sympathetic installation to listed church buildings as well as the permission / consent process.

There will also be an overview and explanation of the Ecclesiastical Exemption within the planning context and the opportunity to informally ask questions of the HES team.

Three SEC charges whom already have solar panels installed on their church buildings will also be providing their perspective and experience on the performance of panels at their property.
