

### St James Stonehaven: A "Resilience Hub" for the Town

Paula Fogiel (St James' Stonehaven) writes: St James church hall is now an emergency resilience hub with-

in the town in partnership with the Stonehaven and district community council.

The Community council has a robust action plan/ procedure should our hall need to be used, this can be viewed on the community council's website.

We have a Generator point in the hall which will power the heating and lighting to enable people in the town to come to us in the case of an emergency such as a power an outage or flooding. We also now have a socket with USB points which will help to charge peoples phones as necessary.

The Generator will be bought to the hall and plugged in by an approved person, this will enable us to help in any way we can.

A member of the community council will be on hand as this will cover insurance compliance and we (volunteers) will be on hand to supply Teas/coffees (a supply of this will always be available in church) and basic support.

Paula is the named person with the community council, so contact her (via the office) if you have any questions.
