Brechin Diocese Festival of Lay Ministry: 17 May at Dundee University Chaplaincy

The Festival of Lay Ministry – a whole-day event for the entire Diocese seeking to celebrate, resource and encourage lay ministries of all shapes and sizes— will take place at the University of Dundee Chaplaincy Centre, on Saturday 17 May, running from 9.30 – 4.00 pm. The day will include workshops focused on different aspects of lay ministry; discussion; and worship led by both experienced lay leaders and novices.

A central part of the day will be the "Marketplace of Ministry", where each congregation is being asked to showcase an example of lay ministry in their church. These do not need to be specifically worship or Sunday focused: they could be e.g. lay ministry in care homes or schools, musical ministry, peer support or anything at all that committed lay people carry out on behalf of the church. 
<u>Creative ideas for Lent and Easter with</u> <u>all ages</u>
