Festival of Lay Ministry – but what do we mean by Lay Ministry?

If the term brings to mind just Lay Readers and Eucharistic Assistants – think again. In Paul's letters to the early churches, he goes to great lengths to remind us that we all have gifts and, for the church, and indeed for society, to function, we need all of those gifts. Paul's message is that God has given us gifts and talents to use for the benefit of the whole community. As he writes in his letter to the Romans,

We have different gifts, according to the grace given to us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith. If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach; if it is encouraging, let him encourage; if it is contributing to the needs of others, let him give generously; if it is leadership, let him govern diligently; if it is showing mercy, let him do it cheerfully.

And if Paul had been writing that letter today, he might have added that, "If a person's gift is IT, let them manage the church website conscientiously, if it is hospitality, let them organise the refreshments tastily!" And we could add so many more things.

One of Festival of Lay Ministry workshops will be looking at the ways you can use your gifts and hearing about what people are already doing. Some of the most important and effective outreach is done through lay ministry — positions that have no title and no fancy outfits, just people willing to use their God-given gifts for the benefit of the wider community.

So, whatever your burning desire is, come along and talk to people who can set help you achieve it.

SEC Net Zero Team Update: The 2024 Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) Now Open for Completion: Please Open the Email and Complete Now!

From Prof Peter Sharp, Diocesan Net Zero Lead:

All vestry treasurers should by now have received an email asking them to complete the latest return of the Energy Footprint Tool. Contrary to what you might see on the website, the deadline for returns is **Easter Sunday, 20th April.**

The latest version of the return has been simplified and, even with my chaotic filing system, it only took me 15 minutes to complete. It is important that we provide this information to the Net Zero Team to allow them to monitor the progress that is being made towards the target. The percentage of charges in the Brechin diocese making a return last time was not the highest in the Province, so let's see if we can improve on that. Remember, failure to submit data may compromise your ability to access Net Zero finance.
