New Provost Announced to Serve in St. Paul's Cathedral, Dundee

It was announced on Sunday that the next Provost of St Paul's Cathedral, Dundee will be the Reverend Roxanne Campbell, presently acting as Interim Rector in the Cathedral vacancy.

Following Canon Elizabeth Thomson moving to become the SEC Provincial Director of Ordinands last August, the vestry and

Bishop have been working on the recruitment process with significant congregational input into Profile and Specifications for the Provost. A strong field of candidates was interviewed by Bishop and vestry and the clear decision made, with the vestry, to offer the post to Roxanne.

Roxanne was ordained in St Paul's Cathedral in 2019 after training in the Scottish Episcopal Institute. She served as a curate in Dundee, then was a transitional minister and incumbent for St Martin's Dundee along-side being 'Priest for Outreach' in the Cathedral.

Bishop Andrew said, 'Roxanne is a very gifted priest with extensive experience both in her ordained ministry in this Diocese and in her previous secular career. I am delighted that she has accepted the offer to become our next Provost and I look forward to working with her in her new role in the Chapter and the Diocese."

Roxanne said, "It is an honour to be appointed the next Provost of this Cathedral. Having journeyed alongside the faithful and vibrant community that is St. Paul's for several years, I am looking forward with joy to continuing to serve alongside you and exploring together how we might grow ever more fully into our calling as a Cathedral for this city — a place of welcome, witness, and hope at the heart of Dundee."

The details of dates and timings for her service of institution will be worked out in the next little while, so please watch out for details of services and events.

Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) Deadline Approaching: 20th April

From Prof Peter Sharp, Diocesan Net Zero Lead: All vestry treasurers should by now have received an email asking them to complete the latest return of the Energy Footprint Tool. Contrary to what you might see on the website, the deadline for returns is **Easter Sunday, 20th April.**

The latest version of the return has been simplified and it only took me 15 minutes to complete. It is important that we provide this information to the Net Zero Team to allow them to monitor the progress that is being made towards the target. The percentage of charges in the Brechin diocese making a return last time was not the highest in the Province, so let's see if we can improve on that. Remember, failure to submit data may compromise your ability to access Net Zero finance.
