Assisted Dying Workshop Held for Brechin Clergy and Lay Readers

A training afternoon was held in All Souls' Invergowrie on 2nd July as part of the clergy and lay reader training programme for the Diocese. Co-ordinated by Rev Denise Herbert, the Diocesan Safeguarding Officer, the subject was assisted dying, a matter very much in the news as legislation passes through both Westminster and Holy Rood.

Input was given by Dr Holly McGuigan, Consultant in Palliative Medicine at Ardgowan Hospice Greenock and the Venerable Peter Potter, former Archdeacon from Switzerland.

Peter talked about the experience of clergy in Switzerland, where assisted dying has been lawful since 1941. The spiritual and pastoral impact of a person's decision to opt for assisted dying can be a complex matter for clergy to handle pastorally. He also talked about the details of the Swiss approach and presented some of the statistics regarding suicide, assisted dying and palliative care in countries where the law permits this practice. Holly shared her experiences of palliative care in Scotland today and how assisted dying might impact on the palliative care sector. Palliative care is significantly funded in Scotland by voluntary donations, with differences in the balance of NHS and charitable support in different areas. She discussed the importance of dignity for end of life work and also the recognition of the reality of 'spiritual distress' in this important work.

Both Peter and Holly expressed the view that it would appear that a form of assisted dying will become lawful in Scotland in the near future, so churches and clergy will have to engage with some of the pastoral and practical consequences of such a change in the law.

Former Rector and Dean, Reverend Robert Breaden RIP

The Rev Robert Breaden, one time Rector of St Mary's Broughty Ferry and Dean of the Diocese of Brechin, died on 3rd July aged 87.

Robert was born in November 1937, and trained for the ministry at Coates Hall in Edinburgh from 1958 to 1961. He was ordained deacon in 1961 in St Paul's Cathedral Dundee, then ordained priest in 1962. He served his curacy in Broughty Ferry, then was Rector at Holy Rood Carnoustie from 1965 to 1972. He was then appointed Rector of St Mary's Broughty Ferry in 1972, a post he held until retirement some thirty-five years later in 2007. He was appointed Dean of Brechin by Bishop Ted Luscombe in 1984, a post he held, eventfully, until retirement in 2007.



In retirement he acted as 'Priest with Charge' for St Columba's Portree and associated churches on the Isle of Skye, then he fully retired to the Diocese of Moray, Ross and Caithness in 2012, living in Evanton to the north of the Black Isle.
