All Change for Clergy at St. Mary Magdalene's Dundee and Dean Kenneth

Dean Kenneth has finished his time as the Interim Rector for St Mary Magdalene's Church in Dundee, after five years of serving and supporting that church community.

Kenneth started as their priest in June 2020, in the middle of the first COVID-19 lockdown. His licensing service was a Zoom event, attended by the congregation and even the late Rev David Shepherd, whose retirement as Rector created the vacancy. In the past year Kenneth started to share his time with St Ninian's Dundee, and as he finishes at St Mary Magdalene's he will continue in a part time role in Mid Craigie.

Dean Emeritus Fay Lamont will take care of St Mary Magdalene's as they start this period of vacancy. Fay in retirement has been acting as an Associate Priest at the church, as well as assisting with other charges in Dundee.

Advertising for a new priest for St Mary Magdalene's will start imminently, in a new shared ministry between the Dudhope Crescent church and St Martin's in the Hilltown area of Dundee. This role is part of the Diocesan vision for healthy, supported ministries in the city.
