Refreshments and lunch will be provided for the Synod.


Anyone who wishes to attend and observe this meeting of the Synod is very welcome, but again please let the office know for catering.

The Energy Footprint Tool - What we've learned. 6/11, 1-2pm

For the last two years, every Charge in the Province has been asked to complete the Energy Footprint Tool, usually just referred to as the EFT. The data gathered allows each Charge to see the size of its carbon footprint and track changes, particularly when measures have been put in place to reduce this footprint. This is an opportunity to explore what the EFT is revealing and how we can streamline the process for Charges to collect this data.
