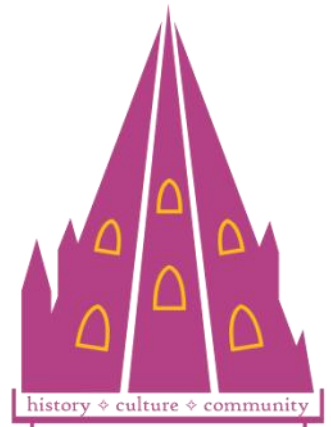

A note: The College of Bishops have, in 2026, changed the default time of year for Scottish Episcopal Church ordination from Michaelmas (end of September) to Petertide, the end of June. Both are traditional times for ordinations, and Petertide fits better with the current pattern of theological training in the Scottish Episcopal Institute.
